However, recommendations suggest enhancing industry-academia collaboration, updating course content to align with current trends, and incorporating more skill-based and experiential learning opportunities. Faculty members have emphasized the need for more flexibility in course structures, while students advocate for improved access to digital learning tools. These suggestions will guide future curriculum revisions to ensure the programs remain robust, competitive, and aligned with academic and professional excellence.



The syllabus is need-based and suitable to the course







Employability and skill development are given due weightage in curriculum design and development




































































































































































































